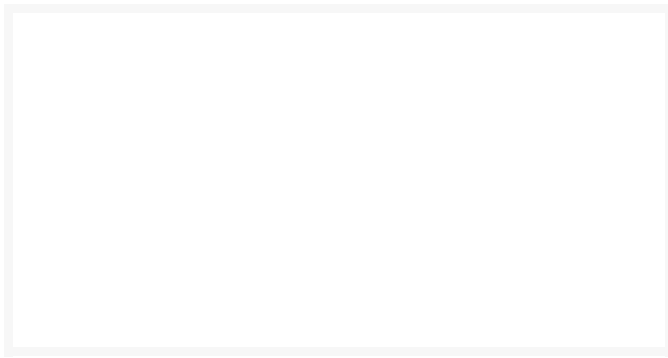
DO look at online consignment stores...
